Construction has indeed begun on the historic African American Golfers Museum and ICYG Clubhouse which will provide a continuous home for "growing the game of golf!" It will be located at 125 13th Street, Riviera Beach, Fla..

About the AAGHOF and the AAC&YGHOF

"The purpose of the African American Golfers Hall of Fame is to celebrate and honor the history and achievements of African Americans in the game of golf." As well, "The purpose of the African American Collegiate & Youth Golfers Hall of Fame is to establish an organization where the best young golfers can challengingly meet, share their golf stories and make new friends from around the globe."

Both organizations: African American Golfers Hall of Fame, started in 2005, and African American Collegiate and Youth Golfers Hall of Fame, founded in 2007, were founded by Malachi Knowles.

This mission of both organizations is becoming a reality since receiving the African Cultural Grant from the state of Florida in the amount of \$490,233.00; however, they still need to raise another estimated \$350,000 through an engaged fundraising campaign to complete the project.
